## A Message from your Minister

## **RETUNING**



### Dear Readers,

I write this on the hottest day of the year, reflecting that this is weather for the beach and not for dog collars and work. Still, not long now until a week away in France and an opportunity to recharge the batteries after a full and eventful year.

Though in terms of spiritual refreshment, I don't know whether *recharging the batteries* is the right image to be thinking on. Batteries are items that we need to supply ourselves with in order to make things work - as we often discover to our irritation, when we unpack whatever we have bought and find we should have read the small print that tells us, "Batteries not included".

Rechargeable batteries don't work forever either. Sooner or later they lose their capacity for supplying energy. Our Christian faith on the other hand, however we have embraced it, whether through baptism or some other form of commitment, connects us straight to the mains, the source of Life! The love of God, shown to us supremely through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, embraces us in the life-giving power of the Holy Spirit, as she fills our lives with assurance and confidence in Christ.

The challenge is that our reception gets distorted through the static of life, stuff, our preoccupations, and the interference of our busyness! So from time to time, we need to retune and clean and sharpen up our contact points.

That I think is a more helpful picture, because it reminds us that the initiative always lies with God. All we are called to do is respond. Our responsibility lies in making ourselves as open and receptive as we can be to God's gift of life. Spiritual writer, Ann Lewin, says that hymns like 'Father hear the prayer we offer,' put in front of us a spirituality which leaves us no time for resting in God to sharpen up our contact points. She has therefore rewritten the hymn, and I offer it here to you for reflection.

Drive us and load us up with guilt.


Time enough for courageous living

## presents "Bring me Sunshine"




Holidaying at Home has returned to Highlands again this summer. We set the bar for fun so high last year I have really enjoyed trying to make this years event similar yet different.

## Serving the Homeless / HARP

The very enjoyable Afternoon Tea arranged on 8th June raised £571.

Unexpectedly, Serving the Homeless has also received £700 from the Southend Charity Football Competition as we were the nomination of Bridgemarsh Reserves FC who won their division.

In addition we received £352 from the East Essex Players as a result of an Indian Meal in Benfleet.

We are very grateful for all this additional support.

Thank you for your continued prayers and items at the back of the church. There is still an urgent need for smaller sizes of clothing, including underwear, together with trainers, jeans, sunscreen and toiletries.

I append an extract of a Report from HARP on 5th June this year.

As of 5/6/17 HARP has 174 units of accommodation.

50 units are to be used as part of the 'House First' model to address the problem of persistent rough sleepers. These units have few conditions that have to be complied with and are therefore more likely to succeed with the harder cases.

Last year the "Bradbury Centre" assisted 1104 people. The numbers seeking help has declined for a number of reasons, one being that HARP is more successful in getting people into housing that they can sustain, therefore they are less likely to become homeless again. The 'stock' of homeless people is therefore gradually being whittled down. However new cases are presenting all the time.

Of the 1104 assisted last year **57%** were found to have mental health problems. It is now the main presenting factor and is increasingly so among young women.

Of the whole group, 578 were of no fixed abode, i.e. sofa-surfing etc. 400 were at risk of losing their tenancy and 126 were sleeping rough. The report on the Winter Shelter programme was very positive. HARP believe that their policy has been successful. The numbers show that 128 people used the Churches Winter Night Shelters. Of these:

## 124 worked with HARP services. 52% have now been housed 8 have accessed employment

## 18 have been placed in Treatment programmes

The average stay was **16 nights**. The overall number of people using the night shelters, including the Shelter at the Bradbury was **217**.

The Service Manager's Report showed 326 clients accessing meaningful.

The Service Manager's Report showed 326 clients accessing meaningful activities run by HARP. 45 people had found sustainable work. Some had transferred to council accommodation. Examples given included a client (female) who had presented with mental health issues, who had completed their 'Heads Up' course and subsequently was able to her Masters Dissertation and is complete now in accommodation. Another client (male) had been asked to leave the family home by his mother, who was embarking on a new relationship. He had been sleeping rough, and then took an overdose. He was put in the Night Shelter at the Bradbury then moved into a HARP property, then the Acorn project and finally into Council accommodation. This young man had somehow managed to maintain a part-time job throughout this terrible period.

The other main points:

The Acorn project, which houses 30 young people( predominately 18-25) is now under discussion as the properties in York Road owned by Estuary Housing are due to be redeveloped in 12-18 months as the existing stock is no longer in a fit state. This would leave 30 young people without accommodation until the rebuild was finished. HARP are therefore looking to purchase a new site in Southchurch Avenue and develop a 'Halls of Residence' type building so that there would be somewhere for these clients to live while Estuary redevelops their site. Discussions are in an advanced stage. The two developments would eventually add an additional 30+ units of accommodation for HARP. Finally, Ceylon house is having an extension built which will provide 7 more rooms and the White Heather House Project is nearing completion with 11 ladies already in residence.




